Happy New Year!

Rev'd Rob Anning, Superintendent Minister, writes:

This is my first opportunity to wish everyone in the Banbury Methodist Circuit a very "Happy New Year!" I suspect it is going to be an interesting, exciting and scary year. I think it will be an *interesting* year because 2011 is the "Year of the Bible". This year marks the 400th anniversary of the first authorised translation of the Bible into English: the King James Version (KJV) or Authorised Version (AV).

Throughout the year, there will be lots of events and activities taking place around the Northampton Methodist District (*see another page for details of a District Event in High Wycombe on Saturday, 12 February*). The Circuit have purchased a leaflet called "The Bible Reading Challenge" and everyone in every church/chapel in the Circuit will receive a copy. The challenge is to try and read more of the Bible during 2011. And nationally, there will be lots of activities under the name of "Biblefresh" to encourage the Bible to read and studied more often both inside and outside the church.

I think it will be an *exciting* year because the Circuit Meeting approved a proposal by the Circuit Leadership Team to employ a Lay Worker for three years from September 2011, to work alongside three or four of our rural chapels to help them make connections with their communities. This is a new venture for our Circuit. It is exciting when you start out on something new and challenging. This is a step of faith as we try to become more mission oriented as a Circuit; as we try to reach out to share our faith beyond our churches and chapels.

I think it will be a *scary* year because during June, July and August, Rev'd Dorothy Hewitson will be on sabbatical and as a Circuit we will need to try to adjust our ways of working with just two Ministers rather than three. Of course, Dorothy's sabbatical is only a dry run for what the Circuit will be like beyond September of this year. For then Dorothy steps down from full-time ministry to half-time and Rev'd Janet Jackson takes on two additional chapels as part of her work load and I take on one additional chapel. There will be lots of changes, challenges and adjustments to make.

At the start of the year, that all feels to me as being rather *interesting, exciting and scary*. I ask you all to surround these activities with your prayers and to step into this New Year together with the confident knowledge that God journeys with us:

SUMMARY OF THE MAIN POINTS OF BUSINESS FROM THE CIRCUIT MEETING HELD AT EASINGTON ON 29TH NOVEMBER 2010

The meeting was chaired by Revd. Rob Anning. News from around the Circuit revealed a variety of activities, many of which have been reported in this newsletter.

Safeguarding: Maurice Humphris, the Circuit Safeguarding Officer presented a brief report, noting that we are still awaiting the results of the government review of the proposed vetting and barring scheme. The new Methodist Safeguarding Handbook comes into effect from 1st January. Gill Crippen, the District Safeguarding Officer hopes to visit the Circuit soon to meet as many church safeguarding officers as possible, so watch this space for a date.

Finance: The final accounts for 2009-10, (un-audited at the time of the meeting), were received. For the first time in several years we had not had to draw on our general reserves in order to meet our regular financial commitments. This was due to a transfer into general funds of £4000 from the Circuit Model Trust Fund (formerly the Advance Fund), and refunds of expenses incurred during the process of two chapel sales. It was noted that because of the sale of Chipping Warden and Balscote chapels, the Model Trust Fund balance had increased by approximately £200,000.

Manses: Jean Swift reported on maintenance of the manses. The District Inspection of the Kingsway manse had produced a favourable report. A few matters need attention and will be put in hand. The major work next year will be replacement of the central heating boiler and system plus related work at Sycamore Drive.

Property: Val Trinder reported on the closed chapels. A planning application is under way for conversion to a dwelling at Warmington, and at Brailes we are attending to necessary repairs required by our surveyor's report prior to sale. The meeting discussed insurance, noting that SmartWater marking of all valuable items including roof lead, is a Methodist Insurance condition. Hornton are currently receiving quotes for their building scheme and St Francis are busy fundraising for their extension. The Superintendent reported that a number of potential partners have expressed interest in the development of the Fairway site. The intention is that a partner organisation would re-build and run new premises which would include a space for church use.

Lay Worker: Rev. Rob Anning outlined proposals for the employment of a "Rural Church and Community Co-ordinator", to work in the Circuit, initially for 3 years, to help facilitate development and outreach in some of our rural chapels. The meeting considered an outline of the duties and person specification. The Charity Commissioners expect us to use our reserves and the costs can comfortably met from the Model Trust Fund given the new income from chapel sales. It was likely that we could also obtain a District grant. It was unanimously agreed to proceed with this.

Ministerial sabbaticals: Rev. Dorothy Hewitson will be on Sabbatical from June to August 2011, and Rev. Janet Jackson from May to July 2012.

Year of the Bible: 2011 is the 400th anniversary of the King James' Bible. There will be a number of initiatives nationwide to encourage everyone to look at fresh ways to engage with the Bible. Watch this space for more on what we will be doing.

Diary dates: Circuit services will be held at Marlborough Road in the morning (10.30 am) on 13th February, 19th June and 4th September, and in the evening (6 pm) at Hinton on 27th March, Marlborough Road on 15th May (this will be the Circuit Easter Offering Service) and Adderbury on 31st July.

Next meeting: at Adderbury Tuesday 8th March, 7.30pm.
