Dear Friends

The Methodist Church Christmas theme for this year is "hush the noise". Christmas is loud, so much expectation, so many voices telling us what to wear, how to celebrate, what to eat, and what to buy.

When I was younger Christmas was a time of surprises. The excitement of a stocking full of small brightly coloured parcels, which until they were opened defied definition. Today we tend to ask people what they would like.

Lists are produced, 'tokens' are purchased, or money is given with a note – it's better if you choose it yourself! Of course, that way we avoid getting the same thing twice over or the wrong make of aftershave. No longer does the grandson have to put up with winter underwear four sizes too big when he was hoping for a new computer game.

A statement in response to the resignation of the Archbishop of Canterbury

In light of the resignation of the Archbishop of Canterbury following the Makin Review into abuses by the late John Smyth QC, the Methodist Church in Britain joins others in praying for all those affected by abuse. Survivors have been courageous in speaking of their experience and in calling the Churches to account and we hope humbly to continue to learn from them.

We are Covenant Partners with the Church of England, an anniversary we marked in November. Dr Welby has done much to strengthen the partnership between our denominations and we pray for the continuation of this work and for those who will discern who should be the next Archbishop of Canterbury. We are committed to developing our shared understanding and desire for good safeguarding practice at every level of our churches.

<u>Angels:</u> Whenever angels appear in the Christmas story they say, "Don't be afraid". This happens four times during the events of the birth of Jesus. Someone has counted the number of times "don't be afraid" is said in the Bible - 365 times. That's once for each day of the year. Obviously, God doesn't want us to live in fear.
