

IT'S JUST A THOUGHT

'Jesus took Peter, James and John, and led them up a high mountain. And He was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no one on earth could bleach them...... Then from the cloud there came a voice, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!' Mark 9:2-9

Dear friends

In this mountain-top experience the disciples see Jesus as he really is: - the Son of God; the man from heaven. It was as though a curtain was opened before their eyes and they see for the first time the reality of Jesus' heavenly glory. This is then amplified by the Father's voice from heaven with that instruction to "listen to him". The Bible teaches us that one day all the world will see the glory of Jesus for themselves, but in the meantime it is a matter of faith. We understand it rather than know it. We might sense it in worship or a beautiful moment of creation or love, but it seems to lie beyond our everyday experience of life, yet the Holy Spirit within, constantly points us towards this heavenly reality. The glory of Jesus is not dependent on our activity or efforts, it has been a constant from the beginning of time. And the way and the times God chooses to reveal himself is not our decision, but God's. Yet, the decisions and choices we make and the way that we listen to and follow Jesus, all enhance or otherwise the chances of seeing and experiencing the glory of God in Christ Jesus.

As we continue to journey through Lent to the glorious spectacular surprise of Easter morning I was reminded by a friend, that God also reveals his glory and truth in the small things as well as the spectacular. How true that word is!

Take a moment to listen to Him and you will catch glimpses of His glory for yourself.
